Brief description	The sweet potato is a tuber belonging to the convolvulaceae family, native to South America and consumed in many parts of the world for its ease of cultivation, taste and nutritional properties.	
Objectives	 learning how to grow sweet potatoes in urban gardens Learning how to prepare a bed for growing sweet potatoes Selection of seeds suitable for sweet potatoes 	
Materials	For sowing: -Sweet potato seed -Solid organic fertiliser -Sowing bed	
Implementation	Step by step: 1- Select the seed, for this step we have three options: A- Select a cutting of the plant and sow it in a pot or nursery for transplanting later. B- Sow the cutting directly on the cultivation bed.

	C-	Plant the sweet potato directly into the soil.
	2-	We prepare the seed bed by breaking up the soil well, to a depth of about 30 cm, so that the tuber can develop better.
	3-	Mark out on the seedbed the points where each seed is to be placed, about 30 cm apart.
	4-	We make the holes where we have marked, the size of each hole will depend on the seed we are going to sow (cuttings, seedlings or directly the sweet potato).
	5-	Add a little mycorrhiza to each hole (optional).
	6-	We sow the sweet potato seeds and fill the holes with our organic fertiliser (compost).
	7-	We water our flower bed.
Evaluation	1-	We can try all three types of seeds (cuttings, seedling or sweet potato) and evaluate the performance of each in our seed space to determine what works best for us.
	2-	After sowing, we constantly observe the development of our plants to ensure that they have adapted to our seedbed and that our crop continues to grow well.
	3-	At harvest time, we can weigh the amount of feed obtained and get an approximate yield for our seed bed.
Tips	- - -	It is advisable to cover our cultivation bed with a covering of organic matter, in order to take care of the moisture and nutrients in our soil. Sowing on the quarter moon is recommended. The sweet potato is a climbing plant and it is
		important to bear in mind that it can invade the space of another plant we are planting, so it is important to provide adequate space.
