

Exercise “Intercultural future workshop”

Aim

This exercise is designed to encourage members to think about the future possibilities of the garden if intercultural aspects are given greater consideration and multicultural target groups are specifically involved.

Materials

Large sheets of paper or a whiteboard, Pens & Sticky notes

Procedure

Brainstorming: each member receives sticky notes and writes down ideas on how the garden could be enriched by including different cultural perspectives and practices.

Possible questions for inspiration:

- How could our garden benefit from intercultural activities?
- How can people who are not yet involved in the garden benefit from intercultural activities?
- Who is not part of the garden and why?

Discussion and collection: The sticky notes are pinned to the large paper or board. The group discusses the suggestions, groups similar ideas and prioritizes them together.

Develop a vision: Based on the ideas collected, the participants develop a vision for the future of the garden that takes greater account of intercultural aspects. What could the garden look like? Who could use it? What activities could take place?

Action plan: A concrete action plan is developed from the vision, which includes the first steps towards implementing the intercultural approaches. Who will do what and by when?

Follow-up: The results of the workshop are documented and published in a visible place in the garden or online to inform all members and visitors about the planned developments.

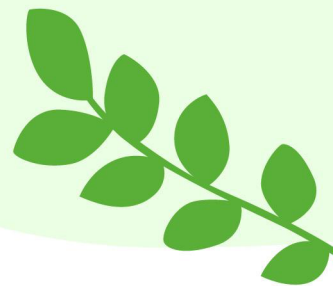
This exercise not only encourages reflection on the potential of the garden, but also initiates concrete steps towards actively shaping an intercultural community garden.



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
