



EXERCICE - Visit an intercultural community garden

Objective: Learn from an intercultural community garden to gather ideas and inspiration for fostering diversity in your own garden.

Steps

Identify a community garden focused on intercultural gardening, either locally or online. Use social media or gardening networks to connect

Prepare Questions

Think about what you want to learn. Examples:

- How do they involve diverse communities?
- How do they address language or cultural barriers?
- What activities or events have worked well for intercultural exchange?

Plan a Visit or Online Meeting

- Visit in Person: Talk to organizers, participate in activities, and observe their practices.
- Virtual Meeting: Request a virtual tour or photos to see their setup.

Bring a Cultural Element

- Share something from your culture (e.g., seeds, a recipe, or a story) to spark conversation and mutual exchange.

Document Your Experience

Take notes and, if permitted, photos. Focus on their approach to community building and intercultural practices.

Reflect and Share

- Discuss what you learned with your team.
- Identify 1–2 ideas to implement in your own garden.

Stay Connected Build an ongoing relationship with the garden for future collaboration and idea-sharing



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
