



How to find a space for the garden

Objectives: to identify spaces that are suitable for an intercultural community garden

Neighborhood Walks: Organise walks with your group to explore potential sites. You might look for interesting spots on the aerial view online or simply be guided by the knowledge and interests of your group. Discuss the advantages and disadvantages of each location.

Mapping Sessions: Hold mapping sessions where people from the neighbourhood can mark potential sites on a map, identifying available land or underutilised areas. This can be done at a neighbourhood party, or simply in a public park with a big map.

Collaborate with Local Authorities: Meet with local government officials or neighbourhood management to identify public lands that could be designated for community gardens.
